AN EXCLUSIVE INTERVIEW WITH **DENTIST JAMIE!**

What inspired you to become a dentist, and how did you get started in the field?

I was a bit of a feral child and was always getting into scrapes and bumps. I managed to smash my front teeth a couple of days before I was supposed to have my braces fitted. Because of this, I was in and out of the dentist like the hokey pokey. My dentist was a proper surfer dude from Cornwall and we had many of the same interests and he got me interested in it all. Once I had expressed some interest, we looked into how to make it happen. Dentistry is a competitive course to get into and it needed a lot of work to make it happen. Fortunately, my parents could take me to get the work experience I needed for my application and after getting the grades I made my way up to Newcastle!

Can you describe a typical day in your role as a dentist at our clinic?

Once this is done we start seeing patients on our first appointment of the day at 8am, that's when the fun begins. Every day can be different and provide its own challenges and surprises. My typical day is a mix of everything from checkups and fillings to porcelain veneers and dental implant surgery.

What do you find most rewarding about your work in dentistry?

As dentists, we are in a privileged position where we can not only help people but also see the impact of our work. Seeing the bravery of a person who has neglected their teeth but is determined to turn things around is amazing. There's nothing better than helping them do it and seeing how they change throughout the process. Seeing the difference in people as they regain their confidence in their smile and regain control of their oral health is so rewarding.

What are some of the common misconceptions about dental health that you often encounter?

Rinsing with mouthwash. Most people use mouthwash straight after brushing their teeth because that's what seems to make sense. Really though it's washing all the beneficial ingredients off their teeth and straight down the sink. A great time to use mouthwash is after lunch or when you get home from work - or any time other than straight after brushing!

How do you stay updated on the latest advancements and techniques in dentistry?

There's a fantastic community that revolves around dentistry. Things like Local study clubs, dental shows and conventions are a fantastic way to keep up to date. Especially since the pandemic, there's a lot of online content so you can learn from globally acclaimed dentists while you're still in your slippers. When I can, I also enjoy going to dental courses as well (especially if they're somewhere sunny) to swat up on my favourite topics. It's a great excuse for a trip to the other side of the world!

What advice do you have for patients to maintain good oral health between visits?

BRUSH YOUR TEETH. Twice a day!

And for some North Shields news, the Shields Ferry has secured funding for the new landing!

To the dismay of local residents, North East mayor Kim McGuinness has pledged a cash injection that will allow for the building of a new north landing for the popular river crossing.

The Shields Ferry has been a topic of conversation for many years since the warnings that the current landing will be in an unusable condition by 2025.



£14.6 million is need to build a replacement closer to the North Shields Fish Quay but there have been a number of setbacks that have caused costs to increase and struggles to get funding. Now with some funding secured, works are estimated to begin in 2026 though full proposals are yet to be submitted.

Dame Norma Redfearn, the elected mayor of North Tyneside, welcomed Monday's announcement as "brilliant news for the residents, businesses and communities along the banks of the River Tyne". She added: "We have bold plans for North Shields and our historic fish quay, delivering this connectivity by securing the ferry service will help to boost those plans and attract visitors, support residents, and help our businesses. The ferry landing is a rich part of our history and has been a heartbeat of our communities for years, it will be part of a bright future as part of our ambitions for the borough."

These false teeth, called pontics, can be made from gold, alloys, porcelain, or a combination of these materials. Bridges are supported by natural teeth or implants.

Benefits of Dental Bridges

- 1. Restored Smile: Bridges fill the gaps caused by missing teeth, restoring your smile and the natural contour of your face.
- 2. Improved Chewing and Speaking: Missing teeth can affect your ability to chew and speak. Bridges help restore these functions.
- 3. Preventing Tooth Movement: Gaps in your teeth can cause remaining teeth to shift over time, leading to bite problems and misalignment. Bridges prevent this by maintaining the position of your teeth.
- 4. Aesthetic Appeal: Modern bridges can be made to look like your natural teeth, enhancing your overall appearance.

The Procedure: What to Expect

For both crowns and bridges, the process typically involves two visits to your dentist. During the first visit, the dentist prepares the tooth by removing any decay and shaping it to fit the crown. In the second visit, the temporary crown or bridge is removed, and the new permanent one is checked for fit and colour before being permanently cemented in place. Your dentist will ensure the restoration is comfortable and functions properly.

Proper oral hygiene is essential to maintain the longevity of crowns and bridges. Brush and floss daily, and avoid chewing hard foods that could damage the restoration. Regular dental check-ups will allow your dentist to monitor the condition of your crowns and bridges, ensuring they remain in good condition for years to come.







COMPOSITE BONDING OR VENEERS?



WHAT IS COMPOSITE BONDING?

Composite bonding is a cosmetic dental procedure that involves applying a tooth-coloured resin to the surface of your teeth. This resin is carefully shaped and polished to match the surrounding teeth, resulting in a natural-looking enhancement.
